Standing tall nearly 20 years later at the corner of Columbia Street in Downtown Covington, the JLGC headquarters, Dogwood Cottage, became a reality in its present form in 2004.

And just as the ink was drying on the building deed for the new headquarters, Dogwood Cottage would subsequently sustain damage by Hurricane Katrina within that same year. 


