# Letter From the President

It's fall in southeast Louisiana, which means cooler evenings, small-town festivals, and football.

While we still have another month until the vibrant hues of autumn transform our trees, fall reminds me of the growth and fortitude the Junior League of Greater Covington has shown over the decades. Even through times of change, our League remained strong and resilient building upon our legacy of women's leadership and voluntarism.

The more than 250 women leaders who make up the Junior League of Greater Covington represent the threads of past, present, and future bound together. When our Founders gathered in March 1977, the world as they knew it was changing—women's roles were evolving and the Women's Movement of the 1970s challenged traditional values.

The first fundraiser to benefit our projects and community assistance grants for the Junior Service League (as it was known then) was a Bargain Fair and Christmas Bazaar. Forty-six years later, we enthusiastically anticipate our reimagined boutique holiday **Sugar Plum Market** at Mercedes Benz of Covington, December 6.

Throughout the 80s and 90s, Junior League of Greater Covington continued to feel the push and pull of a changing community dynamics, becoming advocates against domestic violence and proponents of conservation developing the Northlake Nature Center.

As the demands of the community changed, so did the League: adjusting its organizational model as membership declined during the oil bust of the late 1980s; adopting evening meetings to better fit the schedules of working league women; affiliating to a grander purpose joining the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI), thereafter being known as the Junior League of Greater Covington.

Uniquely, Mary Shoup, President from 1980-81, ushered in the first Junior League fashion show and luncheon, called Cornucopia of Couture. This league year, we pay homage to that with our philanthropic **Carnival Couture** fashion show on January 12, 2024, that will highlight the flair, culture, and exuberance of Mardi Gras season.

Through the 2000s, the Junior League has continued to be an immovable force of women, preparing its membership to take on the challenges of tomorrow. Over the last 20 years, Junior League of Greater Covington has faced hurricanes and a global pandemic, yet the league has endured and continues to find innovative ways to thrive in the competitive nonprofit space.

The Junior League has proven time and time again that we have what it takes to persevere and make a difference not only in the lives of our members, but in our community, and in the world.

The Junior League of Greater Covington continues to be an organization of women leaders holding true to our mission, united in purpose, and guided by the belief that strength is not just physical, but a force that resides in our hearts and minds.

Together - past, present, and future - let us continue to embrace this season of change in the spirit of courage and determination modeled by the Junior League leaders before us who continue to inspire us all.
