

#### AJLI Announces 40 Under 40 & 40 Over 40 Awards

AJLI recently announced its inaugural 40 Under 40 and 40 Over 40 biennial recognitions.

This initiative aims to celebrate and honor outstanding Junior League members who have demonstrated exceptional achievements in various fields and careers.

We believe in acknowledging and highlighting the accomplishments of women who have made a significant impact on their professions and communities.

Both awards will be given every two years. Starting in 2024, 40 Under 40 will be awarded. 40 Over 40 applications will open in the winter of 2025.

To be eligible for consideration, nominees should be Junior League members for at least two active years and embody the following criteria:

#### **Empowerment**

The nominee, through her work and community involvement, empowers both herself and others. Examples may include initiatives that uplift and inspire individuals to reach their full potential.



#### Leadership

The nominee demonstrates outstanding leadership in her profession or area of service through accomplishments, innovations, or a demonstrated commitment to drive positive change.

#### **Community Impact**

The nominee is actively creating a positive impact on her community. This can encompass contributions to local organizations, volunteer work, or initiatives that address community needs.

Nomination forms are available in Digital Cheetah under Resources > Nominating and must be submitted to our nominating committee at <a href="mailto:nominating@jlgc.net">nominating@jlgc.net</a> by Feb. 19.

Those selected and their League will be notified by April 15.

Business School, someone
with a **growth mindset** views


